Opening April 2009:

- •Kindergarten (3 years)
- Elementary School (6 years)
- •(At opening will have years K1-4, with 5 and 6 opening successively the following two years)
- •Still accepting enrollment applications for 2009

- First international school in Japan to be officially accredited as an Article 1 school
 - •Government sponsorship enables <u>much lower tuition</u> <u>fees</u> than other international schools
 - Includes intensive Japanese language and culture
 - •Equipped with a beautiful media center, science and music rooms, and other **state-of-the-art-facilities**
 - •One-story wooden building surrounded by **expansive grounds and greenery** makes indoors and outdoors a connected learning space
- Full **English-immersion** education
- 30% more learning hours than equivalent Japanese public schools
