KIZUNA

Japanese words used in the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM) such as "bento", "sensei", and "jidosha" had their origin in Japanese Administration Period between 1914 and 1945 when students studied Japanese language in schools. With this historical relationship as a backdrop, Japan has been extending Development Cooperation Assistance to the FSM people based upon KIZUNA (Strong Bonds) between us.

Humanitarian Relief Measures for the Typhoon Maysak Damages
