The Total Amount of Japan's Official Development Assistance (ODA) to Nigeria (till 2014) :

1. Loan aid: 86.6 billion Japanese Yen (approx. 149.6 billion Naira)
2. Grant aid: 294.5 billion Japanese Yen (approx. 508.8 billion Naira)
- *including the debt relief signed in 2006: 24.39 billion Japanese Yen
3. Technical assistance: 17.0 billion Japanese Yen (approx. 28.3 billion Naira)
- *5,545 trainees have been trained, 469 specialists have been dispatched (2013).
4. Grant Assistance for Grass-root s Human Security Projects: USD 10,006,502 (2000-2015)
- *Calculated on the assumption of the exchange rate of 100 Japanese Yen to 172 Nigerian Naira

Key sectors

Japan has cooperated with Nigeria to develop different sectors including Infrastructure (power supply, transportation, etc.), urban environment (waste management, water resources, etc.), achievement of inclusive growth, peace building and tackling terrorism, through four arms of ODA projects (Loan, Grant, Technical Assistance and Grant assistance for Grass-roots human security projects).
