- 1 country replied that the NDP is evaluated by a number of Ministries.
- 1 country replied that government is evaluating NDP by signing a contract with the Civil Organization Society.

Difficulties for Evaluating the NDP:


- 6 countries said they had a limitation of reliable data.
- 4 countries replied a lack of coordination amongst stakeholders.
- 3 countries replied lack of evaluation experts.
- 3 countries replied low level of technical capacities of the evaluation organization.


How the SDGs are Monitored:


- 5 countries replied the SDGs are monitored by lead Ministries/Offices.

- 2 Countries relied they have prepared policy acts for the monitoring of the SDGs.


Difficulties for Monitoring the SDGs


- 8 countries replied limitation of reliable data.

- 2 countries replied low level of technical capacities.




























