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## Japan's ODA in strengthening M&E

- Actively support the development of systems for the implementation of the SDGs in developing countries (Goal17.9) and the improvement of data collection and statistical capacity (Goal17.18 and Goal17.19).
- For example,
  - Support to strengthen the government monitoring and evaluation system in Nepal
  - Support to national target and indicator setting, action plans, and establishment of M&E mechanisms in Indonesia
  - Support to the African Regional SDGs Center in formulating action plans
  - Human resources development in monitoring and evaluation in Asia and the Pacific countries



## Partner country-led evaluation by MOFA



### **Objectives:**

- To enhance evaluation capacities of partner countries
- To reflect various viewpoints and ensure objectivity in ODA evaluations

#### **Evaluators:**

- Government officials, academia, experts or consultants of partner countries
- Can be joint evaluation

#### **Evaluation Criteria:**

- Based on OECD-DAC Evaluation Criteria
- Relevance of Policies, Effectiveness of Results, Appropriateness of Processes


# Capacity Building for Improved "Project Evaluation" Design, Implementation and System Institutionalization (2020-2022)

- The program aims to enhance the participants' knowledge on the project evaluation methodologies and their evaluation capacity.
- The program is designed for middle management executives in policy making or evaluation operation departments from central ministries, agencies and governmental organizations.



# Historical background of M&E in Japan





#### M&E capacity development

- ➤ 2020: JES members published "Handbook of Program Evaluation"
- Mid-2010: A few university introduced evaluation class in their public administration course in collaboration with JES
- ➤ 2008: JES started training course of Certified Professional Evaluator
- ► Mid-2000: Some universities started to offer practical course
- ► Mid-2000: Some private institutes started M&E training courses
- ➤ 2000: Japan Evaluation Society (JES) established
- Mid-1990: FACID started M&E training with PCM method mainly for government/JICA officers, private consultants etc.

## JES M&E training program



- Certified Professional Evaluator Course
- Period: 6-day training (7 hours/day),
  conducted twice a year (spring and autumn)
- Participants: 30-40 trainees/course \* it is always become full within several minutes.
- Course requirements: it is desirable to have evaluation experiences
- Participation fee:
  - JES member 77,000yen + exam fee + text fee
  - Non-JES 104,500yen + exam fee + text fee
- ◆ Contents: 6 Units (see the chart →)
- After attending the course and passing the examination, JES Certificate of Professional Evaluator provided
- Language: Japanese
- Instructors: JES members including professors and consultants
