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At current rate of progress on SDGs in the Asia Pacific, what percent of the 118 measurable targets will be missed?



- 1. What are the gaps, and what **support is needed** by countries to strengthen the monitoring and evaluation of the SDGs in the Asia Pacific?

**SDGs Promotion Roundtable** 

A 'whole of society' approach

- Countries differed in specific strategies and mechanisms used to monitor and evaluate the implementation of the SDGs
- All 11 countries have dedicated public institutions mandated to monitor SDG implementation.
- 80% (n=8) of the country respondents have M&E embedded in the implementation of SDGs in their respective countries, although with varying frequency of conduct.

#### KEY FINDING 3

# There are data challenges and a need for capacity-building support

#### **Gaps Identified**

- Lack of experience in gathering data, measuring, and reporting on SDGs
- Insufficient data for collection and reporting
- Mainstreaming at sub-national levels needs more work

#### **Support Needed**

- Capacity building for data, and monitoring and evaluation
- Strengthening National Evaluation Policies (NEPS)





### **Conclusions and Recommendations**

Finding 1. A common commitment towards achieving the UN Sustainable Development Goals, adopted uniquely in every country

Finding 2. M&E of SDG Implementation has a learning path

Finding 3. There are data challenges and a need for capacity-building support

More platforms, forums, and mechanisms for knowledge sharing among country experiences with M&E of SDGs

VOPEs could help government institutions in charge of monitoring and evaluation with capacity building

Improve collaboration and coordination by better understanding the differences in knowledge, application of policy and practice of M&E of SDGs amongst stakeholders like public sector organizations, CSOs, academicians, etc.

Focus group discussions with different stakeholder groups to assess the type of capacity building support required

Gaps to be addressed for the next study: Widen sample of respondent, increase the number of responses from each country and stakeholder types
