Japan provides over US\$ 200 thousand for 6 projects in Cambodia (Rasmei Kampuchea 22/07/01)

The government of Japan has decided a grant worth of US\$ 226,342 (mistaken figure, it should be US\$ 266,342) for six KUSANONE's projects in Cambodia.

The first project, which costs US\$ 18,065 and implemented by the Rural Community and Environment Development Organization (RCEDO), is to Support Well Construction in Oddar Meanchey Province.

The second project is to Provide Secondhand School Equipment to Primary Schools in Phnom Penh. The project's cost is US\$ 73,310 and the recipient is the Office of Education, Youth, and Sports of the Municipality of Phnom Penh.

The third project is to Provide Secondhand School Equipment to Junior High Schools in Chamkar Morn District, Phnom Penh. The project's cost is US\$ 64,469 and the recipient is the Bureau of Education, Youth, and Sports of the Chamkar Morn District, Phnom Penh.

The fourth project is to Provide Secondhand School Equipment to Junior High and High Schools in Don Penh District, Phnom Penh. The project's cost is US\$ 69,905 and the recipient is the Bureau of Education, Youth, and Sports of the Don Penh District, Phnom Penh.

The fifth project is to Construct a School Building at Chun Long Primary School in Siem Reap Province. The project's cost is US\$ 22,378 and the recipient is Chibaken Lions Club Cambodia Project (CLCP).

The six project is to Construct a School Building at Tuol Roka Kos Primary School in Phnom Penh. The project's cost is US\$ 18,215 and the recipient is the Tateyama Minami Lions Club.

The six projects will be signed by Mr. Gotaro OGAWA, Ambassador of Japan to the Kingdom of Cambodia and the representatives of recipient organizations at the Embassy of Japan on July 20, 2001.

Up to the present, including these six projects, a total amount of US\$ 10,551,402 has been provided by the Government of Japan through the "KUSANONE" scheme to assist 193 projects in Cambodia.
