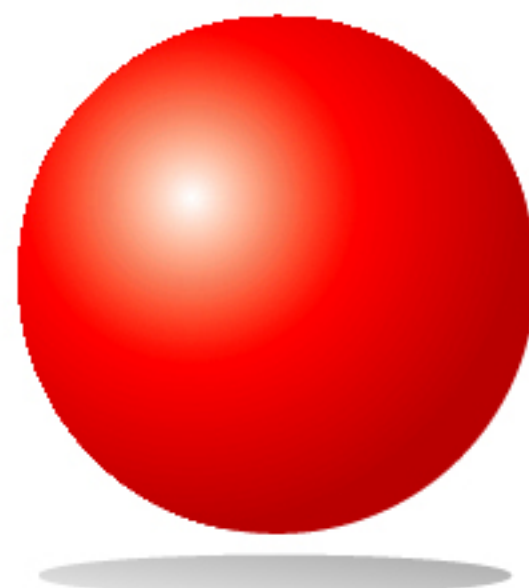


Satellite Symposium

This symposium will address the HIV/AIDS issue in light of the new concept "Human Security", which the Government of Japan is promoting in the international community, based on the report of the Commission on Human Security submitted to the UN Secretary - General in May 2003.

Human security entails protecting and empowering people and communities from critical and pervasive threats to human lives, livelihoods and dignity including HIV/AIDS. For these objectives, human security tries to strengthen initiatives that emphasize human-centered perspectives. This symposium will highlight the roles of the government, civil societies and donors in protecting people and communities vulnerable to and affected by HIV/AIDS and in empowering them.
