Australia's approach to peace-building

- 'Whole of Government'
 - knowing the role of each agency in order to better understand the big picture
- Coordinated response to issues
 - Military and police address security challenges
 - Civilian public servants and other experts address longer-term capacity issues
- Work with international stakeholders to ensure cost effective outcomes and reduce duplication

Australia's approach to training and dispatching police

- Australian Federal Police (AFP)
 - International deployment group (IDG) provides capacity to deploy Australian Police overseas
 - IDG Pre-Deployment Training Team provides training to both Australian police and officers from other countries
 - Training is focused on core skill requirements and cultural, human rights and international standards awareness







Australia's approach to training and dispatching public servants and other civilians

 Australian Agency for International Development (AusAID)

- Fragile States and Peace-building Unit works with other agencies dispatching civilians to conflict-prone societies
- AusAID Peace and Conflict/Humanitarian Adviser provides pre-deployment awareness training

How Australia can collaborate with Japan and other Asian countries on peacebuilding

- Initiatives under the Australia-Japan Joint Declaration on Security Cooperation
 - Contribution of a trainer to Japan's Pilot Program for Peacebuilding
 - Attendance by a member of Japan's National Police Agency (NPA) in the AFP's IDG pre-deployment training
 - Development of linkages between agencies across the entire peacebuilding field
- Other Australia-Japan initiatives under consideration
 - 3 month staff exchange between the NPA and the AFP
 - Secondment of a Japanese advisor to an established AFP mission
 - Ad-hoc international AFP seminars on various issues
- Possibilities for collaboration with other countries
 - Participation in the Australian Defence Force Peacekeeping Centre's annual International Peace Operations Seminar (IPOS)
