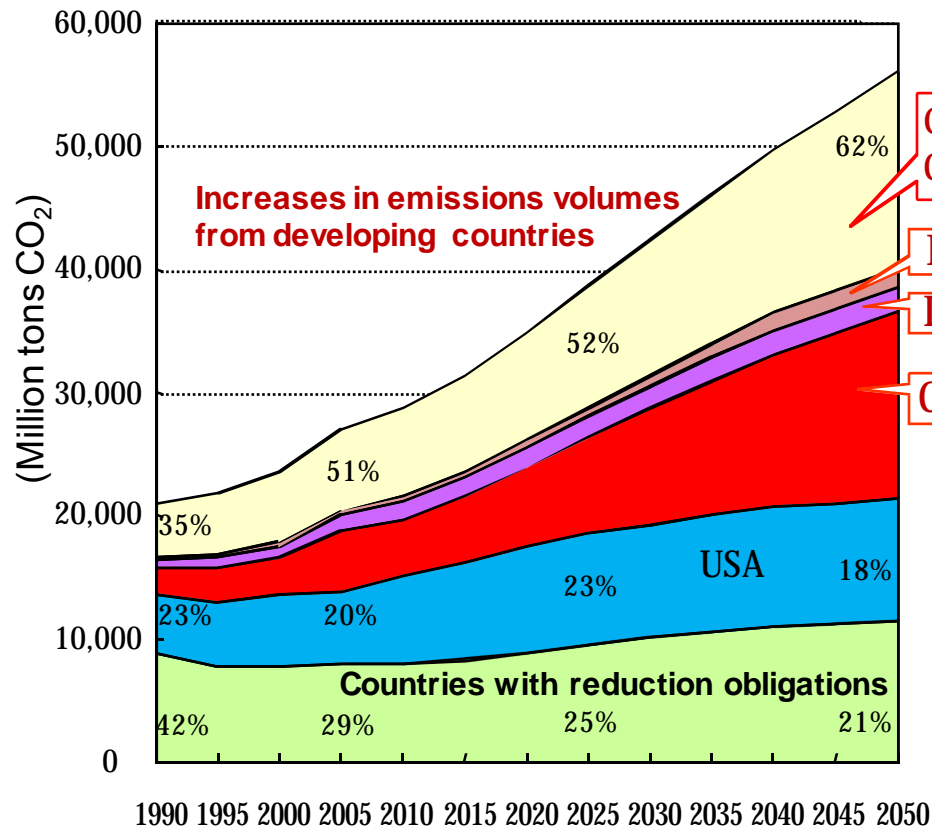

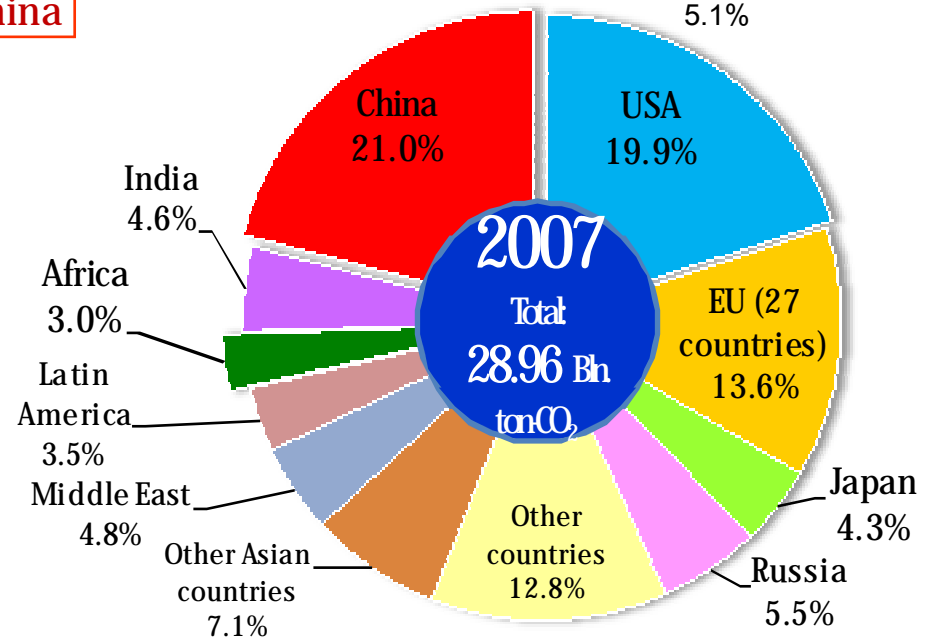
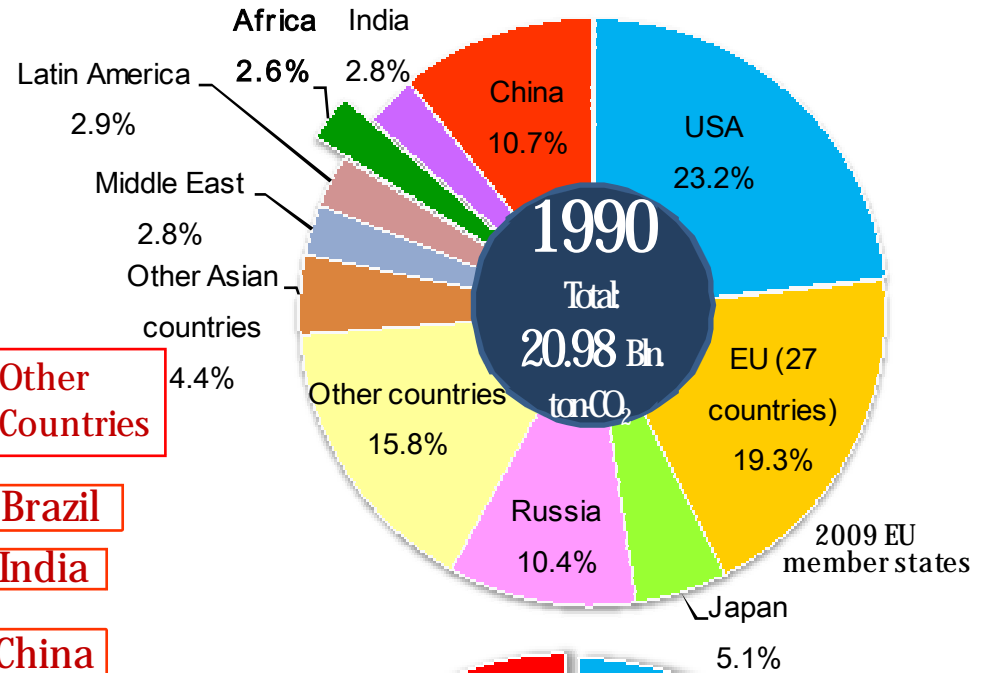

# Assistance to Developing Countries until the end of 2012 by “HATOYAMA Initiative”

## Objective

Assist developing countries, especially in those that are tackling reduction of emission and/or being particularly vulnerable to climate change.

Include REDD+

Focus on Capacity Building

## Schemes

Approx. 7.2 billion dollars

- Grant Aid
- Technical Cooperation
- Concessional Loans
- Contribution to Multilateral Funds

Approx. 7.8 billion dollars

- Other Official Financing (mainly for Energy Conservation Projects)

**TOTAL: 15 billion dollars**

## Specific Areas of Assistance

- Energy Conservation and Clean Energy
- Forestry Preservation
- Disaster Prevention
- Countermeasure against Environmental Damages (e.g., by flood and drought)
- Biodiversity Conservation
