Unique forum to strengthen bi-regional interaction


- The Forum for East Asia-Latin America Cooperation (FEALAC) was established in 1999 to strengthen cooperation between East Asia and Latin America.

The key objectives of FEALAC:

- -To increase mutual understanding, trust of political dialogue and friendly cooperation among member states with a view to enriching and sharing experiences and developing new partnerships.
- -To tap the potential of multidisciplinary cooperation, inter alia, in economics, trade investment, finance, science and technology, environment protection, culture, sport, and people-to-people exchanges.
- -To expand common ground on important international political and economic issues with a view to working together in different international fora in order to safeguard our common interests.

Overall agenda covering politics, economy and science & technology

- The member countries exchange views on a wide range of issues in the Foreign Ministers' Meeting.
- Three Working Groups (Politics, Culture and Education WG: Economy and Society WG; Science and Technology WG) are held once a year to share the best practices.

Foreign Ministers' Meeting I/Chile

EALAF was officially renamed FEALAC (Forum for East Asia-Latin America Cooperation), and the Framework Document for the foundation of FEALAC was adopted, which contained the purpose, principles, and operative direction of the forum.

2004 Jun.

Foreign Ministers' Meeting II/ Philippines

The Manila Plan of Action, which proposed a concrete course in fostering mutual understanding and cooperation between the two regions, was adopted.

2007 Aug.

Foreign Ministers' Meeting III/ Brazil

The Brasilia Ministerial Declaration and Programme of Action was adopted. In this declaration, the member countries outlined a concrete proposal regarding the future direction and action plans for the further development of FEALAC.



The bi-regional trade has **quadrupled** since the establishment of FEALAC




Both regions remain modest trade partners with each other

CO₂ emissions (2006) 9,963 mil/28,002 mil (tonnes of CO₂)


