Exceptions from Most-Favored-Nation Treatment

Schedule of Japan

Japan takes an exception to Article 59 for treatment accorded under all international agreements in force prior to January 1, 1994.

For international agreements in force or signed after January 1, 1994, Japan takes an exception to Article 59 for treatment accorded under those agreements involving:

- (a) aviation;
- (b) fisheries; or
- (c) maritime matters, including salvage.

Schedule of Mexico

Mexico takes an exception to Article 59 for treatment accorded under all international agreements in force prior to January 1, 1994.

For international agreements in force or signed after January 1, 1994, Mexico takes an exception to Article 59 for treatment accorded under those agreements involving:

- (a) aviation;
- (b) fisheries; or
- (c) maritime matters, including salvage.

For greater certainty, Article 59 does not apply to any current or future foreign aid programs to promote economic development, such as those governed by the Energy Economic Cooperation Program with Central America and the Caribbean (Acuerdo de San José) and the different OECD instruments on Export Credits.
